

Entry-level riders kicked off the 2017 Reining Australia National Championships on Tuesday afternoon under the eye of judge Debra Versluis in the Thomas Arena Products Green Rider classes. More than 50 competitors used the relaxed Green Rider rules, riding two-handed and with optional simple lead changes, to get the feel of a reining show at the national level.

Sarah Rawson-Harris and Mississipis Destiny won the buckle for Green Rider Level 1. Craig Hall, riding Wimpys Little Terminator, outscored the other Level 2 Green Riders to take out the top spot in this class.

Our international judges, Joe Hayes (USA) and Alessandro Milani (Italy), took their places early on Wednesday morning for the largest draw of the show when 70-odd horses contested the Xtreme Genes Novice Horse classes.

The Novice Horse Non Pro Level 1 buckle went to Anthony Ross and Einsteins Revelation. The winner of the Novice Horse Non Pro Level 2 class was decided by a run off between Lee Thomson riding Eskdale West Judgementday and Denise Milgate on RKN Two Eyed Kid with Lee and Judgie proving the victors.

Yves Cousinard and Spin Me Please came up with the double for the Novice Horse Open classes, taking home the buckles for both Level 1 and Level 2.

The feature event on Wednesday afternoon was the Ed Smith Reining and Performance Horses Snaffle Bit Futurity. Cameron Halliwell and Shine It Up a Notch won the Non Pro division while John Wicks rode Onya Shiney Nu Toy into first place in the Open division. This was a great finish to the first full day of the show and was an exciting sneak peek at the calibre of the 2017 Futurity horses.

The Hygain Rookie Level 1 and Level 2 opened Thursday's program with another big draw of more than 50 horse and rider combinations for the judges to consider. Sharon Leddington-Hill and Migs Shez Dynamite showed their heels to the opposition with a convincing win in the Rookie Level 2. Sharon's score of 144 in this class was the highest score by a Non Pro rider at the show.

The Rookie excitement continued with a run off for the Rookie Level 1 buckle between Sarah Rawson-Harris on Mississipis Destiny and eventual winner Kasey Bogie riding Lyrics Custom Corey.

The very well supported Mr 4X4 Freestyle class followed after the break. Chris Gould outperformed a posse of youth riders to win this event on Malibu Lena.

Thursday was rounded off with the running of the K Ranch Open and K Ranch Non Pro with 35 of the best and bravest horses and riders in the country.

Cameron Halliwell and Gottagetagunner topscored in both the Open and the Non Pro. It was an emotional moment when he was awarded the Michelle Halliwell Memorial trophy for his win in the Non Pro class.

Another draw of more than 50 horses opened the program on Friday with the Intermediate Non Pro, Southern Cross Saddlery Intermediate Open and Southern Cross Saddlery Rookie Professional classes. Rod Osborne and Kitten Revolution won the Intermediate Open, Kurt Melling and Predator took the Intermediate Non Pro buckle home to New Zealand and Chris Gould on Malibu Lena was the winner of the Rookie Professional class.



The more mature riders came out next for the Koyuga Electrics Prime Time Non Pro, won by Kathleen Murphy on Checkout Hollywood. Experience was followed by youth.

Joey Reedy rode Princess to victory in the Short Stirrup. Kasey Bogie and Lyrics Custom Corey picked up their second buckle in the Youth 13 Years and Under while Grace Christoffel and Lethal Katie won the Youth 14 to 18 Years class.

The pinnacle of Friday's program and one of the highlights of the show was the SnS Custom Floats Gold Buckle Futurity. Craig Cowley riding his own horse Time To Shine won the Level 1 division of the Futurity for riders just starting out in NRHA events.

The Limited and Intermediate divisions of the Futurity were won by Rodney Peachey riding Peter Bartolo's entry Gunnerreload.

Gunnerreload's score was also more than enough to take home the biggest prize of the show, the Open division of the Gold Buckle Futurity. Wins in the three divisions added the AQHA incentive cheques to the pony's take home pay. In addition to buckles, trophies and prize money, Gunnerreload brought his owner a top-of-the-range horse float sponsored and built by SnS Custom Floats of Bundaberg in Queensland.

2017 QUEENSLAND STATE REINING CHAMPIONSHIPS

We expect clear skies in early August in Queensland. The sunshine is always reliable but some years the wind has a sting in its tail. This year, for the first time, it didn't matter what the climate gods had in store for us. We were safe within the shelter of QSEC's stunning new covered warm-up area.

The winter weather was perfect throughout the show but we were still grateful for the comfort of a welllit hangar-sized second arena with ample room for separate circling, stopping and marshalling areas.

The show was well supported with about 400 runs over four days. The stabling and camping was near enough to fully subscribed within 24 hours of opening for bookings so QRHA knew that we were on track for a bumper show.

Thank you to all competitors for making the trip from as far afield as central Queensland and the central coast of NSW.

Judges Darren Simpson and Pam Spokes shared their duties across the classes and joined forces in both chairs for the big events: Open/Non Pro on Thursday, Non Pro Futurity and the Non Pro Derby/Open Derby on Friday and the Open Futurity on Saturday. We thank them for their care and dedication.

The show started on Wednesday with a full day of non-sanctioned events. This was a great test of the new arena setup and all credit must go to gate marshal, Glenn Muir. He rounded 'em up and kept them coming with consummate skill.

Noel Watson and Colonel Einstein (70) won the Junior Horse Open. Noel backed up the win with a second place on Helen Balu's 3-year-old, Mighty Red Pine (69). Greg Walker rode his Futurity prospect Ruf N Twisted (68½) into first place in the Junior Horse Non Pro, half a point in front of Dennis Neylon and Wimpys Lil Miss. There were around 60 horses in the Junior Horse line up, all of them a credit to their owners and riders.

The concurrent Beginner Rider and Beginner Youth classes followed. Justine Brown took home the blue ribbon for Beginner Rider on Wimpys Playgirl (69). Top scorer in the Beginner Youth, also on a 69, was Kristy Smith on Hollywood Blue Chip. Congratulations to the 30 riders in this draw. We hope you all will keep on riding and sliding with us in 2018.

The 40 horses in the Senior Horse classes rounded out the long day. Noel Watson and Einstein Flashy Jac ran a 71½ to win the Senior Horse Open. Kathleen Murphy and Checkout Hollywood picked up the Senior Horse Non Pro with their score of 70½.

Thursday morning kicked off early with the first of the sanctioned classes, the Novice Horse. This was another 50-horse draw across all divisions. Dennis Neylon and Wimpys Lil Miss (70) made a clean sweep of the Novice Horse championships and the buckles. John Wicks and Onya Shiney Nu Toy (69½) were reserve champions in the Novice Horse Open Level 1 while Noel Watson and Snippin Cash (69½) filled the reserve position in the Novice Horse Open Level 2. Robyn Ross and Atomic Blonde (69) picked up the reserve sashes for the Novice Horse Non Pro Level 1 and Level 2.

More than 30 Green Rider competitors faced the judge in their classes. Sidney Paech and Onya Wozza (68) won the Green Rider Level 2. There was a tie for first place in the Green Rider Level 1 between Marni Baker on Quirran Lea Spinamiss and Jordan Rogers on Voila Petit Pas, both on 67.

The final event on Thursday was the concurrently run Southern Cross Saddlery Open and Non Pro classes. Once again, there was great support from competitors for these classes. There were 20 horses in the draw with 13 entries in the Non Pro and 10 in the Open. Pattern 9 was the task for horses and riders and we experienced our first run-in pattern in the new arena setup. Nobody used the full 60 metres available but everyone appreciated the generous straight approach to the gate.

Noel Watson and Einstein Flashy Jac took out the Open championship with their score of 142. Kathleen Murphy and Checkout Hollywood filled the reserve position in the Open on 141½. This score was enough for the combination to win the Non Pro championship, one point ahead of reserve champions Erin Neylon and Lil Miss Genius (140½).

Friday is a big day at the Queensland State Reining Championships with two feature events scheduled in the afternoon and evening, the Non Pro Futurity followed by the Derby. First up in the morning were the Rookie Level 1 and Level 2 classes with more than 30 horses nominated. Rookie Level 2 champions, Sharon Leddington-Hill and Migs Shez Dynamite with 71, squeaked in just ahead of reserve champions Kurt Melling and Predator on 70½.

Things were less clear-cut among the 26 Rookie Level 1 competitors. There were three riders on 69. In a commendable display of competitive determination, they elected to run off for the champion's buckle. Mike Adamson and China Doll were the final victors, with Marni Baker on Quirran Lea Spinamiss and Deb Segeren on Ruf Lil Renee sharing the reserve spot.

Another draw of around 30 horses and riders presented themselves to the judge for concurrently run Darling Downs Vets Intermediate Intermediate Non Pro and Rookie Open. Professional classes. Intermediate Open champions were Helen Balu and Whizkey On The Rocks (71) with Denise Milgate and RKN Two Eyed Kid (70) filling the reserve place. These positions were repeated in the Intermediate Non Pro class. Chris Gould on Malibu Lena and Craig Cowley on Time To Shine were Rookie Professional co-champions with both running a score of 68.

Meanwhile the Joyce Olsen Memorial Non Pro Futurity riders were gathering in the warm up arena, loping circles, adjusting skid boots, brushing tails and concentrating on their big moment. The Queensland crowd gets right behind the Non Pro Futurity competitors, encouraging them and cheering for them every step of the way through Pattern 5.

Hayley Saunders on DNA Genetics won all divisions of the Non Pro Futurity with a score of 140. It wasn't an easy win. Three horses were in reserve position, one point behind on 139: Jason Melling and Ill Be Back, Helen Balu on Mighty Red Pine and Kayla Kington on QMatch Cool Jake. Kyley Norman and Shiney Is My Name were half a point behind them and Greg Walker on Ruf N Twisted and Andrew Behrens on Hollywood Black Jac were one point behind Kyley on 137½.





UPDATED CRITERIA FOR WEG QUALIFICATION

QUALIFICATION PERIOD: 1 JANUARY 2017 TO ABOUT AUGUST 2018 (TBC) MINIMUM QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (ART. 303 REINING RULES) **UPDATED 21 JUNE 2017**

To be eligible to compete either as a member of a team or as an individual at the 2018 FEI World Equestrian Games, an Athlete must be qualified as FEI 3* Athlete (Art. 302.5.1) and achieve a minimum average score of 70 at two out of three different CRI3* (Championships excluded), all completed with no elimination, disqualification or withdrawal, during the qualification period.

One of the qualifying results as defined above must be achieved no earlier than on the 1st January 2018 and no later than the end date of the qualification period.

Nations who enter a Team must have organized a CRI of any level or a Reining Championship in their home country during the qualification period. It is not compulsory for the Team members to have participated in this CRI/CH.

Each NF may enter one team of four Athletes and Horses and one additional Individual Athlete and Horse.

An NF that is not able to send a team may send up to two individual Athletes and two Horses who have achieved the minimum qualification criteria as stated above.

Reining Australia will be running one independent CRI3* Reining event at QSEC on 15 April 2018.

So far, a number of US-based riders have expressed interest in qualifying for selection for the WEG 2018 Australian Reining Team. These riders will fulfill their qualification requirements in the US.

NEW DATE FOR CRI3* IN AUSTRALIA: QSEC 15 APRIL 2018

Reining Australia will be running an independent CRI3* event at QSEC on 15th April 2018. The judge will be FEI 3* judge Leanne Bartlett.

Riders must have FEI 3* status to enter this event. Requests for fast track to 3* must be submitted to Equestrian Australia through Reining Australia.

Membership in Equestrian Australia is required for competitors and owners of horses in FEI events. Horses must be at least 7 years of age, be registered with Equestrian Australia and have an FEI Passport.







