



## **Procedure of Sanctioning Clinics with International Trainers**

Reining Australia has the ability to sanction clinics run by Reining Australia Professional Trainers who have fulfilled the requirements (Insurance, First Aid, Working with Children Check, Code of Ethics). For international trainers who are not a recognized Reining Australia Professional an equivalent set of requirements is provided below to sanction clinics.

### Requirements Checklist:

- The international clinician must provide a copy of their professional qualifications for mutual recognition by Reining Australia. These may include but are not limited to, NRHA Professional status, instructor qualifications, OH&S units etc.
- Accept and sign the RA Code of Ethics
- Details of the designated qualified first aider must be provided to RA and be in attendance for the clinic.
- All riders in the clinic must be members of RA or the affiliate.
- If youth are attending the clinic a person with a Working with Children/Blue Card is to provide direct supervision whilst the international clinician is dealing with youth.
- The international clinician must provide a copy of their insurances to RA for approval.
  - If the international clinician's insurances do not meet a suitable level of requirement, however all other requirements are met, the Affiliate may pay a fee of \$20 per rider per day to extend cover to the clinician.

Once all the requirements are met, the clinic is able to be sanctioned by Reining Australia.

If a clinic does not meet criteria for sanctioning and the affiliate proceeds with the clinic, as it is an unsanctioned event the committee, its members and volunteers will not be insured and may be held personally liable for any claims.
