

Reining Australia President's Report

Sire & Dam Programme

As evidenced by the 623 members on the Reining Horses Under \$10,000 Facebook page, the demand is strong for quality reining horses. The fact is the reining horse industry is simply not producing enough horses for beginner and intermediate riders.

When first contemplating this situation it seems odd that there is clearly an unsatisfied demand for which breeders aren't supplying horses. The real problem lies in the in the economics of breeding and professionally campaigning horses - simply put the price customers are willing to pay for trained reining horses does not justify the cost of production.

This industry dilemma is clearly demonstrated in the Sire & Dam programme. Whilst a few Australian stud owners are still willing to donate services, the reality is that the demand for those services has been steadily declining each year. Understandably some of our top stud owners are no longer prepared to participate in a programme that due to industry economics inadvertently advertises their stud's service not being sold at half its market rate.

At our last Board meeting we therefore made the difficult decision to officially retire the Sire & Dam programme.

It is important at this juncture to point out that RA will still honour its obligations to those breeders and stud owners currently enrolled in the programme.

Australian Reining Breeders' Cup As the saying goes - a problem defined is a problem half solved.

The problem for the reining horse industry is that there is not enough financial incentive to justify the cost of breeding and professionally campaigning young horses.

Fortunately the industry has taken matters into its own hands and led by Errol Thomas conceived the Australian

Reining Breeder's Cup (ARBC). The ARBC is a breeding incentive programme modelled around an annual Derby event similar to the NRBC in America.

The Gold Buckle Futurity now followed by the ARBC Derby will go a long way to offering enough prize money over a horse's professional campaign life to incentivise more owners to breed horses specifically to put to trainers.

2014 Reining Australia Derby

As foreshadowed at the AGM, the National Derby will not be held at Q14 in Tamworth this year. Unfortunately the time we are allocated in the Q14 programme and the compromised surface do not provide a satisfactory stage for our best horses and riders to showcase their true ability.

With that being the case we have allocated this event to the NSWRHA State Show for 2014. NSWRHA will be running the event with RA providing \$5,000 sponsorship.

Reining Australia Logo

The Reining Australia logo has been slightly updated to read "AUSTRALIA" instead of "australia.com.au" or "australia.com". We would ask all Affiliates and anyone organising merchandising or advertising to use the official logo. If you are unsure please contact Greg Campbell.

We are also in the process of tendering for the update of all other RA logos including the Futurity, Nationals, Gold Buckle etcetera. Kathleen Murphy is managing the tender, so if any members are interested please contact her.

Reining Australia Website

As part of our presentation and communication overhaul we will also be introducing a new look website in the next month.

In 2014 RA is offering genuine marketing opportunities to our sponsors as opposed to effectively asking taking donations as has been the practice in the past. Details of our 2014 National Titles sponsorship packages will be released in early April through Mick Taylor.

WEG Team Selection

Last weekend saw the last of the CRI*3 qualify events that will be run in Australia. We are now waiting to see if Martin Larcombe qualifies for selection in an American CRI next month. An independent panel appointed by the Board will then select the Australian team by the end of April.

Publication of next month's Slider will be delayed in order to announce the Australian WEG Team.



Correct Bit Fitting Dr. Amy K. McLean, PhD Equine Specialist North Carolina State University

A general rule of thumb when correctly fitting a bit to a horse's mouth snaffle or curb would be to look for one wrinkle in corner of the mouth/lips. Occasionally, a horse that has a very soft mouth may need no wrinkle meaning you loose the bit to one hole or both but it still sits firmly in the corners. The same philosophy maybe used for cathedral bits or bits with high ports because ideally these bits should only be used on a very well broke horse that needs little pressure placed in its mouth for direction or guidance. Some of these bits are often seen in Vaquero or cow horses and again are intended for broke horses that are guided by the rider's seat and legs. The higher port also maybe used to help "set" the horses headed meaning a small amount of pressure is placed on the reins and the horses flexes at the poll, then the withers the croup and has a rounded appearance.

However, please keep in mind allowing a horse to wear a bit that is too low or too high in its mouth may promote an uncomfortable feeling and the horse may exhibit signs of discomfort such as tossing its head, shaking its head and even trying to place it's tongue over the top of the port or mouthpiece.

Also, horses prefer different mouthpieces just like we all prefer different shoes. What's comfortable for one person

may not feel good for another. We also want to make sure that the bars fit the horse properly (the mouthpiece) and again like a pair of shoes this piece of the bit is not to wide or narrow in the horses mouth.

NRHA 2014 HANDBOOK

SNAFFLE BIT - References to snaffle bits mean conventional O-ring, egg-butt, or D-ring with a ring no larger than 4" and no smaller than 2". The inside circumference of the ring must be free of rein, curb or headstall attachments which would provide leverage. The mouthpiece should be round, oval or egg-shaped, smooth and free of wire. It may be inlaid, but smooth and/or latex wrapped. The bars must be a minimum of 5/ 16" in diameter, measured 1" in from the cheek with a gradual decrease to centre of the snaffle. Optional curb strap is acceptable however curb chains are not acceptable.

BIT - References to a bit means the use of a curb bit that has a solid or broken mouthpiece, has shanks and acts with leverage. All curb bits must be free of mechanical device and should be considered a standard western bit. A standard western bit includes:

- 8 1/2" maximum length shank to be measured as indicated in the judge's guide. Shanks may be fixed or loose.
- Concerning mouthpieces, bars must be round, oval or egg-shaped, smooth and free of wire of 5/16" to 3/4" in diameter, measured 1" from the cheek. They may be inlaid, but must be smooth or latex wrapped. Nothing may protrude more than 1/8" below the mouthpiece (bar)
- The port must be no higher then 3 1/2" maximum, with rollers and covers acceptable. Broken mouthpieces, half breeds, and spades are standard.
- Slip or gag bits, donuts or flat polo mouthpieces are not acceptable

CURB - When a curb bit is used, a curb strap or curb chain is required, which must be at least ½" in width, lie flat against the jaw, and be free of barbs, wire, and/or twists.

Industry Behind New Breeding Incentive

For the past few years Australian reining has lacked a high prize-moneyed event for open class horses to go onto after their futurity year. In part this has contributed to the decline in reining horse breeding and the number of open futurity horses.

Modelled on the highly successful National Reining Breeders Classic in the USA, the Australian Reining Breeders Cup's (ARBC) is both an event and industry breeding incentive programme. Its underlying mission is to promote the breeding of reining horses in Australia through the provision of a lucrative and prestigious event specifically designed for the derby year progeny of the best Australian and international reining stallions.

Conceived and promoted by Sheron Park's Errol and Gita Thomas, the ARBC already has the financial backing of reining breeders Greg Campbell and Dennis Neylon plus professional trainers Shaun Saunders, Warren Backhouse, Ed Smith and Darren Simpson.

The ARBC comprises two interdependent components:

- i) an industry breeding programme, and
- ii) the annual show.

Breeding Incentive Programme

Stallion owners pay an annual \$500 enrolment fee for their stud's 4-6 year old progeny to be eligible for that year's ARBC event and corresponding advertising / promotions. This annual enrolment will increase by CPI each year provided the stallion remains enrolled.

If a stallion leaves the programme and then wants to reenter a year or so later there will be an extra 50% reentry fee. Obviously this is designed to encourage stud owners not to pick and choose which years they are in the programme.

Only enrolled stallions and their progeny are eligible for the full benefits; financial and marketing of the ARBC programme.

Stallion Owner Benefits

Stallions enrolled in the ARBC receive:

- Extensive stud promotion throughout the whole year by Reining Australia through its national advertising and promotional activities.
- All stallion owners receive 5% of their stallion's progeny winnings.
- Bonus \$1,000 to the owner of the stallion whose progeny wins the ARBC.

ARBC Show

The annual Derby show will be held in Dalby Qld for the simple reason that the promoter has access to a greater number of non-equine companies and manufacturers that will sponsor the ARBC.

The show will be run over the Easter period each year. In 2015 this will be early April.

Entry fee for the 2015 ARBC event will be \$350 + judges fee.

With the exception of a futurity there will be a full show programme with the usual classes being awarded buckles, prizes and limited prize money for events other than the ARBC.

Saturday's events will be the all new Rooftop Express show, the Ian Saunders Custom Saddles Make It Rein Challenge and the ARBC.

ARBC Prize Money

The initial ARBC event is expected to have a prize pool greater than \$20,000 with prize money be paid in accordance with the Reining Australia Gold Buckle payment system to tenth place i.e. prize money is awarded to the top 10 scores regardless of category.

Trophy buckles and \$800 show bridles will be awarded for the 6 category winners.

- Open
- · Intermediate Open
- · Limited Open
- Open Non Pro
- Intermediate Non Pro
- Limited Non Pro

All competitors run together regardless of category.

Non-Pros are automatically entered in the Open categories as well.

An extra \$2,000 4-year-old incentive bonus will be allocated - \$1,500 to the top professionally run horse and \$500 to top non-professional horse.

A stallion bonus of \$1,000 will go to the winning progeny stud owner.

Non Enrolled Stallion Entries

Progeny of non-enrolled stallions can still enter the event however they are not eligible for the stallion owner's benefits nor will the stallion be promoted. Where a stallion is not enrolled in the programme, or the stallion is deceased, the competitors of that stallion's progeny can chose to collectively pay the enrolment fee and they will be eligible for the programmes full monetary benefits instead of the stallion owner however the stallion will not be promoted.

Reining Australia Sponsorship Reining Australia at its last Board meeting committed to sponsor the incentive programme and 2015 event for \$5,000 as well as providing logistical assistance to the ARBC for the show.

Reining Stars of the Future ALEXANDRA BARRATT

What age did you start riding?

Ever since I was born my sisters had me on a horse, but didn't start competing until I was about 5 years of age.

Reining aspirations?


I hope just to keep my horses and just keep riding and going to shows for fun, to keep the friends that I have and to achieve something.







Shawn Flarida on selecting yearling prospects

Objective

- Recognise and pay tribute to Reining's exceptional mares
- Add prestige and value to those mares and their future foals
- Incentivise owners to professionally campaign more fillies and not just colts

Background

Statistically, there are fewer mares winning reining classes than studs and geldings. This is even more pronounced at the elite Open classes. Quality mares are an essential part of a successful breeding programme, competitively proven mares even more so.

Generally it is considered more difficult for a mare to outperform studs in elite reining competition, particularly in their 3 and 4 year old years. Those that do are exceptional and deserve special recognition.

Eligibility & Categories

All mares showing in NRHA sanctioned classes are automatically entered for one of 3 Mare of the Year categories.

- Open Mare
- Non Pro Mare
- · Futurity Mare

Points are awarded to the mare, not rider. A mare can be ridden by different riders in different events.

Open Mare of the Year

Horses in the Open classes will receive points as Open horses regardless of whether the rider is a Professional

or Non Pro. Horses ridden in the Rookie Professional will also acquire points in the Open Category.

Non Pro Mare of the Year

All Non Pro classes are considered equal - that is to say the Rookie Level 1 class will carry the same weighting as the Open Non-Pro class.

Freestyle, Prime Time, Snafflebit / Hackamore and Futurity classes are not part of the category.

Futurity Mare of the Year

Horses ridden in and eligible for Snafflebit / Hackamore and any Futurity events will acquire points in the Futurity category.

Horses will only gain points in the Futurity category, they will not gain points in other classes e.g. if a Non Pro rides a Futurity filly in the Novice Horse Level 1, the mare will NOT receive points towards the Non Pro mare category.

Conditions

- 1. Points will be gained at all NRHA approved affiliate shows.
- It is the responsibility of the affiliate club to submit points to Reining Australia within the required time period for NRHA approved shows.
- 3. Mares will receive points according to their placing in the class rather than their placing as a mare i.e. If the



mare places 3rd in the class but is the highest placed mare, she will get points for 3rd place not 1st place.

- 4. In concurrently run classes such as Novice Horse and Rookie where there are two levels, mares will only receive points once if they are entered in both levels, and their placing in Level 2 will only count. i.e. if a mare places 2nd in Level 1 and 4th in Level 2, the points will only be taken from Level 2 and 4th placing will apply.
- In other concurrently run Open and Non Pro classes, placing in the Non Pro class will go towards the Non Pro Mare of the Year and their placing in Open class will go towards the Open Mare of the Year.



To enter, simply pay your nomination fee & ride in the Non Pro Class at 2 of our 3 qualifying shows - 1 March, 26 April & 21 June.

Scores will be tracked for each horse & rider combination, with the Top 10 overall scores taking a shot at a 1 in 10 chance of winning the Bob's saddle in our Top 10 Clean Slate Final at Slide to the Nationals in August. *See full terms & conditons as per below

Terms & Conditions

Riders are required to pay a one off \$50 nomination fee to enter (per horse) Class will be run as per NRHA Non Pro rules & regulations. Competition lic required. Open to all Non Pro riders holding current RRHA, NRHA & RA membership No substitutions will be allowed. If a Top 10 rider is unable to compete, their spot will go to the next highest score.





From 24 August to 7 September 2014, Caen in Normandy will host the seventh edition of the FEI World Equestrian Games (WEG) (<u>www.normandy2014.com</u>). The territory of Normandy in France is a place of great natural beauty and architectural and cultural richness. It is also a land of memories. On 6th June 1944, the Battle of Normandy took place on its beaches. This was the biggest military landing operation ever to have taken place and it set in motion the liberation of France and Europe in World War II. In 2014, the year of the World Equestrian Games, there is also the opportunity for visitors to Normandy to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the D-Day Landings.

Australia will be sending a Reining team to WEG 2014. We can nominate six riders, four for the Reining teams event and two individual riders. The team will comprise riders and grooms, and the Chef d'Equipe who is responsible for the coordination of the team. Rodney Peachey, Chef d'Equipe at WEG 2010 in Kentucky, has been appointed to manage the team again in 2014.

FEI & the National Federation

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) (www.fei.org), founded in 1921, is the international body governing equestrian sport recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). The FEI works in conjunction with the National Federation of each member country to regulate and govern the equestrian disciplines recognised by the FEI. Australia's National Federation is Equestrian Australia (EA) (www.equestrian.org.au).

Equestrian sport has been on the Olympic program since 1912 with three disciplines: Jumping, Dressage and Eventing. The FEI is the sole controlling authority among 132 affiliated National Federations for all international events in Dressage & Para-Equestrian Dressage, Jumping, Eventing, Driving & Para-Equestrian Driving, Endurance, Vaulting, and Reining.

FEI Reining

The FEI Reining Rules may be found at this link: <u>www.fei.org/disciplines/reining/rules</u>.

Concours de Reining International (CRI) is the FEI name for Reining competitions. There are many similarities between FEI Reining Rules and NRHA Rules. Patterns 1 to 11 are the same and judging procedures and penalties are identical. A candidate FEI judge must be an accredited NRHA Worldwide judge before he or she can attend a Level 1 Course for FEI Reining judges. To judge a CRI3* event, the FEI Reining judge must be an accredited 3* or 4* FEI Official.

Qualifying for WEG

On 15 March 2013, Equestrian Australia notified Reining Australia of the WEG 2014 qualification criteria for Reining. They are as follows:

Qualification period: 1 January 2013 to 13 July 2014

Minimum qualification criteria (Article 302 Reining Rules): To be eligible to compete either as a member of a team or as an individual at the 2014 FEI World Equestrian Games, an Athlete must be qualified as FEI 3* Athlete (Article 302.5.1) and achieve a minimum average score of 68 at two different CRI3* during the qualification period.

The FEI Reining Rules (Article 302) state that riders qualify as 3* Athletes by advancing through mandatory steps at the 1* and 2* levels. Members of the WEG 2010 Reining team are already recognised by FEI as having 3* status.

No FEI Reining competitions have been held in Australia recently to allow our resident riders to advance to the required level. Therefore, Reining Australia and Equestrian Australia negotiated with FEI to permit us to recommend 3* (Advanced) status for eligible Australians based on a rider's performance in NRHA events.

For the benefit of competitors resident in Australia, Reining Australia, through Equestrian Australia, applied to FEI to add five CRI3* events to the FEI Reining calendar in 2013 and 2014.

- The Queensland State Reining Championships (10 August 2013 at QSEC)
- The Reining Australia National Futurity and Affiliate Championships (25 September 2013 at AELEC)
- EQUITANA (7 November 2013 at Sydney Showground)
- QRHA Qualifier Show (15 and 16 March 2014 at QSEC)

These were CRI3*-B events; no prize money was awarded.

Selection for WEG

Five resident Australian riders have fulfilled the FEI qualification criteria for WEG. Mick Taylor (Spinin Up Dust) and Shaun Saunders (Playgirls Whizz) started their campaign at the Queensland State Reining Championships under FEI 4* judge Ollie Griffith. They ran Pattern 10 for scores of 70 and 71.5 respectively.

The next outing for aspiring WEG riders was in Tamworth at the Nationals. The judge was Janette Dublin (FEI 4*) and five riders tackled Pattern 10. Warren Backhouse (Lilmissnoitall) posted the highest score (71.5) followed by Shaun Saunders (Predator) with 70.5, Kate Elliott (OP Whizzel Do) with 70, then Mick Taylor (Spinin Up Dust) on 68 and David Simons (Sweet Serendipity) on 65. These runs completed the qualification requirements for Shaun and Mick.

The next opportunity to qualify was at EQUITANA in Sydney. Allen Mitchels (FEI 4*) judged Pattern 6. Kate Elliott completed her WEG qualification on OP Whizzel Do with a score of 70 and John Wicks threw his hat into the WEG ring with a 68 on Snippin Cash.

The last chance to qualify in Australia was offered to riders when RA scheduled two CRI3* competitions at QSEC on 15 and 16 March. FEI 3* judges Leanne Bartlett and Darren Simpson officiated. Warren Backhouse (Lilmissnoitall) and John Wicks (Snippin Cash) made good use of Saturday's runs in Pattern 9. Warren posted a qualifying score of 141 and John came in with a successful 139. Both John and Warren are now eligible for selection. Three Australians based overseas are also vying for a place in the Australian Reining team at WEG 2014. Results to date from FEI show Shauna Larcombe on Sparkin Tinsel filling 5th place in a field of 20 in the CRI3* in Lyon, France on 1 November 2013 with a score of 218. Austrian Rudi Kronsteiner's winning score at that event of 227 on Whizoom is an indication of the high standard of FEI competition and the scale of the task facing our WEG team. Martin Larcombe rode a 69 on Wimpys Cute Tune in Ardmore Oklahoma on 2 February 2014. Bill Norwood's first CRI3* competition was in Oklahoma City on 27 June 2013 where he scored 139 on One Flashy Rooster. His second and final CRI3* was in Scottsdale, Arizona, on 31 January 2014. His score on Quinberry was a very creditable 145.

Competition to represent their nation will be keen among these riders. The Selection Panel for the 2014 team will be made up of respected individuals familiar with Reining and the demands of international competition and will also include representatives from Equestrian Australia.

The WEG 2014 Australian Reining team will be announced in late April.

Funding


Equestrian Australia, through funding from the Australian Sports Commission, pays the entries for the Reining team and for the riders in the individual competition, and




will provide their uniforms. FEI and the WEG Organising Committee cover the costs of riders at the Games: accommodation, meals, stabling for the horses. The riders must cover their own expenses up to the time they arrive in Normandy at the start of WEG. Team members' expenses include air travel to and from Europe with their competition gear, leasing of horses, transport of the horses to and from Normandy, agistment and foot care of the team's horses before and after WEG, and accommodation during the training camp before the Games. There are no limits placed by EA or FEI on the amounts raised by Reining Australia from sponsors of the WEG 2014 Australian Reining team but there may be limits on coverage that can be given to the sponsors. Team members sign a team member agreement to acknowledge Australia's current FEI sponsors. As long as a sponsor that RA acquires does not clash with one of the EA/FEI sponsors, there are no restrictions on publicity for the sponsor(s).

FEI COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH NRHA & AQHA TO FOSTER GROWTH OF REINING

The FEI has signed a cooperation agreement with the National Reining Horse Association (NRHA) and the American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA), formalising the FEI's relationship with the NRHA and AQHA that has been in place since Reining became an FEI discipline in 2002.

The agreement covers areas of common interest including horse welfare, FEI Rules and Regulations, FEI Clean Sport, stewarding, education and FEI recognition.

Under the agreement, the FEI will have sole jurisdiction over Reining competitions for horses aged seven years and over, and the NRHA and AQHA will manage all competitions for horses of six years and under.

An exception has been made for the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games[™] 2014 in Normandy, where six-yearold horses will be eligible to compete.

"The FEI, NRHA and AQHA, while separate and distinct organisations, have recognised as the major stakeholders in the Reining world that together they can foster the growth of our sport globally, and this agreement is a major milestone in the expansion of Reining", said Bob Thompson, FEI Reining Committee Chairman, who played a crucial role in formalising this agreement.


"Since Reining became an FEI discipline in 2002, we have worked closely with the NRHA and AQHA to grow the sport worldwide, and the expansion has been huge, with 115 Reining events last year compared to just five in 2002", said Bettina de Rham, FEI Director Reining, Driving & Vaulting.

"FEI Reining will again be under the global spotlight this summer at the world's biggest equestrian event, the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games 2014, in the heart of Normandy. Just one month before, the FEI European Reining Championships for Young Riders and Juniors will take place in Switzerland at the beginning of July. Our busy Reining event calendar is a true reflection of just how popular Reining has become amongst athletes of all ages, and we're looking forward to continuing our work with the NRHA and AQHA to foster further growth of Reining worldwide.

The NRHA, based in Oklahoma City (USA), was formed

in 1966 and brings together over 19,000 members, including 1,400 youngsters.

The AQHA, located in Amarillo, Texas (USA), was created in 1940 and is the world's largest equine breed registry and membership organisation. It first recognised Reining as a sport in 1949.



"The NRHA is very excited to be moving forward with its relationship with the FEI, and to growing the sport of Reining worldwide", said Beth Himes, NRHA President.

Don Treadway, Executive Vice President of the AQHA added: "Since Reining became an FEI discipline in 2002, we have seen the sport introduced to several new countries, and we look forward to working closely together with the FEI to advance the worldwide growth of Reining well into the future.
